

Minolta 16P Camera

Introducing the MINOLTA range of cameras, this sub-miniature could well serve as an introduction to the fascinating hobby of photography. For a modest price it provides a simple to use and yet versatile precision camera. The MINOLTA 16P has an excellent ROKKOR lens which gives fine pictures on black and white or colour film.



Sub-miniature' camera giving 20 exposures 10 x 14mm. on unperforated 1 6mm. film, black and white or colour, in daylight loading cartridges.

An f3.5/25mm. ROKKOR lens of fixed focus type is fitted.

Shutter.

A simple, accurate, single speed shutter is used with provision for flash synchronisation.

Film Transport.

The film is advanced, the shutter set, the exposure counter and double-exposure prevention device actuated, all by turning a semi-concealed wheel inset in the rear of the camera.

Exposure Control. A wheel engraved with the stop numbers also has a system of "weather symbols" so that selecting the correct aperture is quite simple.

Other Features. Include co-axial flash socket, smooth acting body release, directvision eve-level viewfinder etc.

It is natural that Japanese binoculars should attract attention throughout the world, in view of the enviable reputation acquired by Japanese camera lenses. All we need say here is that the performance of these binoculars is well up to the standard of the highest class Japanese cameras—due to certain qualities possessed by the raw materials used in glassmaking and to the meticulous care taken in manufacture. The Pal series includes not only conventional binoculars from 8 x 30 to 20 x 60, but also two "zoom" binoculars, with magnifications variable from 7 x to 12 x, one having 40mm. objectives, the other 50mm. These combine, in one instrument a wide angle binocular of excellent light-gathering power with a high-magnification binocular for close examination of very distant objects.

All binoculars are supplied in leather cases and prices quoted include Purchase Tax (which applies to the cases only).
